UPCOMING AGM

The VA are now planning for an AGM in November. The date and venue will be confirmed shortly on the The Village Facebook group and through a separate mailing.

Along with a Q&A session, the major topics will be the budget for 2018, a review of the VA activity for the past year and the plans for the year ahead, VA Board Director changes, parking issues and a status report on the Playground situation. The AGM will be an open meeting for residents of the Village and Members of the VA. Final meeting details will be confirmed shortly.

PARKING

The VA initiative to improve and clarify parking around the Village has uncovered that there are an increasing number of SORN vehicles taking up valuable parking spaces. This situation is happening on the public roads (maintained by the Council) and on VA owned land. It is not permitted to have a SORN vehicle on a public highway and the VA intends to implement the same policy where SORN vehicles are taking up non-allocated parking spaces on VA land.

There will therefore be an addition to the Village Code to prevent our valuable spaces being used in this way. From 1st January 2018 we will increase our actions against any SORN vehicles parked within the Village.

The updated code will therefore include the words SORN vehicles must not occupy unallocated residents or visitor parking spaces.

SPEED


We will hold further discussion during the upcoming AGM in November.

HAZELVINE

The VA has reviewed Hazelvine's operations to identify where there may have been historical problems over responses to residents and are working together with the management team to improve and develop their service



to VA members. The accounts team at Hazelvine have recently been reorganised and a new head of accounts, Brian Parrott, has been appointed at Hazelvine with a mandate to improve their performance. Hazelvine has also updated its website.



A useful feature is the option to set up a direct debit to pay your Rent Charge Deed by Direct Debit. Direct Debits can be paid quarterly at no charge, or payments can be spread over 12 months for which there is an admin fee of ± 16.50 +vat.

If you would like to take advantage of the direct debit option then contact the Hazelvine Accounts team in Letchworth on 01462 475666 or 01628 529765 (the management office at Bourne End) and select the 'Accounts' option to be put through to Letchworth. They will then send a direct debit mandate to you to complete.

BENCHES AND BINS

The benches around the Village have now been re-varnished, repaired and replaced where necessary. In addition, all waste bins have been sanded down, cleaned and repainted back to their original colours. We thank John West for his maintenance skills to achieve this.

As a reminder, the bins around the Village cricket green are for 'casual' rubbish only. There have been several issues where general household waste has been dumped into them which results in them being full. The knock-on effect of this increases general litter over the green. We therefore ask residents to not use these bins for household waste.

REMINDERS

As notified in the June newsletter, two Turkey Oaks and one English Oak in Sergeants Place have to be removed.

This work is scheduled for later this year or early next year. Local residents and businesses will be notified by Hazelvine when the date for the works is confirmed.
